Concurrent Credit at Mid-Prairie High School

Concurrent Credit – Community College classes offered in the high school. Students receive both high school and college credit for passing the class. Students should expect to be doing college level work in these classes. Teachers have set requirements, which come from the college that students must meet to pass the class. It is not always possible for teachers to make accommodations/ modifications for special needs students for assignments and tests, beyond extra time. Students will not typically be given shorter assignments or different tests because of the college's course requirements. College Credit accumulates on a Kirkwood Community College transcript and usually are accepted for transfer credit at other colleges and universities, depending on a student's major. These classes must be passed to receive credit and failing one will show up as an F on both your high school and your college transcript. These courses MAY excuse you from taking an identical course at the college level, at the college's discretion.
